### 5. Minutes & Meetings:

### 6. Clerk's Updates, Requests and Communications:

The Clerk reported that:

- Works were scheduled to commence on the Limebank on 16<sup>th</sup> February 2026.
- The Skatepark works were due to commence March 26 with Maes Pennant play area talks due April 26
- Any members who had not yet completed an allowances form for 25/26 were to inform the clerk.
- Following responding to previous offer of a free play box for the community, Flintshire County Council confirmed that it would need to be situated on a play area.

## **9. Police matters:**

Members discussed the Police Commissioners fund and the clerk reported she had been inviting the local PCSO to monthly meetings.

## **10. Lighting & Streetscene:**

Members reported the trees had been removed from surrounding the bus shelter in Rhewl but that a bin was still required at the top of Red Street. The light in Rhewl was still faulty.

**IT WAS RESOLVED:** for the Clerk to request an inspection from Mega lighting.

## **11. Environmental Matters:**

Councillor Ray Knight reported 2 fly tipping issues on the Coastal path and at Lime Bank. Members also discussed items being tipped on Bychton Hall land. Councillor Pam Banks explained that tipping could not be removed by FCC from private land. Members also enquired what had happened to Network Rails intentions to install barriers on the coastal path. Councillor Knight also reported that he had attended a wildlife volunteers day near Caerwys.
